Farmworker Advocacy Organization

Operating in Collier and Miami Dade counties is the Coalition of Florida Farmworker Organization. The non-profit agency assists low income families, the poor, farm workers, and immigrants. They offer emergency assistance and referrals to programs to get people on track for stability. Although the focus is not mental health, they can arrange counseling for mental health and substance abuse help subsidize prescription medications.

Mental Health First Aid

Mental Health Education Program

MHFA is an adult education program designed to increase mental health literacy and includes training modifications to meet the needs of rural communities. It is taught by a

certified MHFA instructor, who is often a staff member from state or local mental health authorities, or from organizations focused on behavioral health, mental health, or addictions. The training is taught in a variety of formats – including online - but most commonly is given through a single 8-hr session or over 2 days in 4-hr sessions.

QPR Gatekeeper Training

Suicide Prevention Program

QPR stands for Question, Persuade and Refer, it is an emergency mental health gatekeeper training intervention that teaches lay and professional gatekeepers (someone in a position to recognize a crisis and the warning signs that someone may be contemplating suicide) to recognize and respond positively to someone exhibiting suicide warning signs and behaviors.

The 60 to 90-minute QPR Training includes an hour of instruction, followed by role-playing exercises, and time for questions and discussion.
